

GOOD SHEPHERD / VOCATION SUNDAY


Bishop Richard writes:

In the second reading of this Sunday, St John writes of the Christian vocation: "Loved by the Father, called to be God's children living lives that will take us to see Him". John invites us to think about the wonder of this calling, this journey, to think about the love that God bestows upon us. It is our life's work to grow in our understanding and true appreciation of the depth and wonder of this gift. It is from this baptismal calling – for this journey begins there – that our very lives flow. This is the starting point for vocation, for discipleship.

We do not make this journey alone – whether our discipleship be expressed in the vocation of marriage, as a single person, in vowed and religious life, or in the sharing in the ministerial priesthood as deacon, priest or bishop. It is God Who calls. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, accompanies us every step of the way, laying down His life for us and the Holy Spirit – in the gifts we receive – is our strength. All is gift. All is the love of God.

It is this context, in this reflection on God's love in His call to every one of us, that the whole Church prays on this "Good Shepherd Sunday" especially for vocations to priesthood and to religious life. Please pray for all those across our diocesan family who sense this call, who are discerning their way, those in our Vianney Group. Please pray for our seminary students, for those embarking on religious life; for those preparing for diaconate and those who will join them this year.

Pray in thanksgiving for all the religious, deacons and priests of our diocese. Give thanks for the response they have given to the specific call they have answered, and for the tremendous gift of service that they are for the Church and the world.



In union with the whole Church, we are encouraged to pray for vocations this Sunday. As Catholics and people of God, we know that God is calling us and has a plan for each of us. He called each of us by name through our baptism to holiness. He continues to call out to us each day to be his disciples: some to the married life, some to the priesthood, some to religious life and some to the single life.

The journey from Eastertide to Ascension and Pentecost calls us to mission. This year, in the light of the new Pastoral Plan, the whole diocese is invited to come together, starting this Sunday, for four weeks of prayer to the Holy Spirit to grant us a missionary spirit, through the raising up of new vocations to all walks of life in the Church. Foremost among these vocations, we need priests. The priesthood is a special gift to the Church through which Christ is always present to pour out His Spirit on His people through the holy sacraments."

Have you ever thought about being a priest, or know someone who has? It's not always easy to know if God is calling you to priesthood. Our diocesan *Days of Discernment* aim to explore some simple tools for finding out, with time for prayer and an opportunity to learn more about the beautiful vocation of the diocesan priest, along with other men following the same path. Certainty is not required: the day may just be a chance for you to start thinking, to pray, and to ask questions. Our next day is on Saturday 4 May in Crawley, led by Fr Nicholas Harden. If you are a Catholic, unmarried male who is considering this vocation and would like to attend, please contact Fr Tristan Cranfield.
