

FOR MOTHERS & GRANDMOTHERS


1st & 3rd Thurs of the Month. 9.45am St Mary's Church Hall, GU2 8BP

THE BIBLE RETOLD BY GYM-JAMS

At GYM-jams, the summer term programme was all about the Bible. See what the youth came up with as a snapshot summary in their final session.

God creates earth and people decide to disobey. Abram goes to Canaan and his name is changed to Abraham. Jacob lives in Canaan with his 12 sons and there was not enough food.

Then the Israelites come to Egypt to meet Joseph. They don't leave and become many in number so Egyptians made them slaves.

God sends Moses to free the Israelites. He gives them commandments (rules) so that they become his people. Then when they cross the river Jordan they enter the promised land Canaan.

The Israelites settle in Canaan. The tribes that are in Canaan do not want to let them get comfortable. Then God gives them judges to help them fight. Judges are good Soldiers The tribes were not very nice.

Samuel is the last judge and prophet but Israel wanted a king. God let them- Saul = 1^{st} King. After came 2 great kings, David and Solomon. There is peace.

Israel splits, north is Israel and south is Judea. They both have a ruler, a few people obey God and the rest don't.

Babylonians attack Judea. People taken are allowed to return to rebuild walls and Temples. They start to hope for a Messiah.

Jesus teaches and heals, dies, rises and goes to heaven.

God sends the Holy Spirit. A Pharisee arrests Jesus' followers. Saul becomes Paul and becomes a follower of Jesus.

More and more people trust Jesus. There are more people following him. He will come back. God will make a new heaven and a new earth(!!) for everyone!



FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

REGISTRATION for the First Holy Communion preparation course is now closed. This year we have over 160 families signed up!



PARENTS ARE THE BEST TEACHERS! Parents are the first and best teachers of the Faith, for their children, so they will play a primary role in the preparation this year. Parents are supported and guided through the course with the help of monthly **Parents' meetings**, **Family booklets**, "**Meet the Priest**" after the morning Mass and **Family Faith days**.

WHAT CAN WE DO? Please join our First Holy Communion Families for Coffee after morning Mass on the first Sunday of each month.

REGISTRATION for Confirmation is open. Preparation takes place when the young person is in school year 10 and above.

THE COURSE runs throughout the Spring Term starting on Sunday 8th January. The sessions take place on Sundays, at St Joseph's Church, from 4.30pm – 7pm. Meetings begin in the hall and then everyone goes up to the church to take part in the 6pm Mass.

Candidates make their Confirmation at during the summer term, with Bishop Richard Moth.
