

### WEEKLY FOR YOUR CHILDREN





In the Spring term, we ran the Youth Alpha course at GYM-jams (ages 7-10) and jGYM (ages 11-13). It was a wonderful experience for all. The faith conversations were rich and we all (re)learnt the basics of our faith. We are looking forward to building on this, so this term we are following a course that takes us through the whole bible. giving foundation а understanding it. At GYM (14-18) this term our sessions were guided by the young people themselves. We looked at a range of things from sharing things they have found funny online, to how to live our faith. This term we'll be figuring out together how to find real freedom in Christ.

Your GYM-jams group is perhaps one of the very few that I've found that intend to help kids grow in faith, while preparing them for the formal youth ministry programs that are offered for junior high and high school age.
